#### Today's geopolitical situation

Did the COVID pandemic play a role?

- The decision for a pandemic treaty / convention or other instrument
- Among others, this decision is coming from the understanding that health is linked to destabilization, security, international relations, in addition to the more technical aspects of pandemics

#### The Golden Age of Global Health

- The early twenty-first century has been described as the "Golden Age of Global Health"
- Building on the HIV/AIDS crisis response dramatic funding increases and institutional developments emerged to solve health crisis
- ODA for health from 6bn to 27bn (2007) to 38bn (2015): new importance of Public Health, but economic orthodoxy still there
- The framework convention on tobacco control (FCTC) was concluded
  - first ever agreement under article 19 of the WHO constitution

#### Framework Convention on Tobacco (FCTC)

- The WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (WHO FCTC) is the first treaty negotiated under the auspices of the World Health Organization.
- Based on the WHO Constitution, Article 19, that refers to conventions
- negotiated during the so-called "Grand Decade for Global Health" (1998-2008)
- with multilateralism much higher in global agenda
- strong civil society voice for a legally binding treaty
- role of private sector "firewall" approach to tobacco industry

#### The FCTC process

- was somewhat straightforward
- in spite of hard stance and disagreements on many issues, countries managed to accomplish a first formal draft negotiating text (a Chair's text) already 6 months after the start of negotiations
- a final agreed draft within six negotiating sessions.
- Is considered a success: today states have ratified
- Tobacco / nicotine usage has been diminished in ...countries.

#### The Pandemic Treaty Negotiations as example

- In December 2021, at its second-ever special session, the World Health Assembly established an intergovernmental negotiating body (INB) to draft and negotiate a convention, agreement or other international instrument
- Today, **November 8th 2023** we are now at the Seventh meeting of the INB (6-10 November 2023)
- Why then developing a new health treaty, and a second in WHO's history, raises these many questions?
   What is so different?



"The World Together": the Intergovernmental Negotiating Body to draft and negotiate a WHO convention, agreement or other international instrument on pandemic prevention, preparedness and response

#### New ways of engaging and grouping by Member States

- Informal negotiations, take much larger role in promoting the formal ones;
- this reflects **strong polarization** around complex, often geopolitical, differences around key areas such as IP, equity, access
- multi-regional "interest" groups of Member States
- the Group of Friends of a Pandemic Treaty, and the Group on Equity, with members from diverse WHO regions, aim at bridging widely shared goals and priorities with regional stands;
- → Geopolitics influence the decisions




#### Armed Conflicts around the World

- Our Rule of Law in Armed Conflict Online Portal (RULAC) classifies all situations of armed violence that amount to an armed conflict under international humanitarian law.
- Today, it monitors more than 110 armed conflicts

- BRICS countries raise their voice
- Powershifts in the world


#### Pandemic Treaty under geopolitical tensions

- Coalitions change and become volatile
- Loss of trust in both national and international politics





#### Crisis – polarisation – health and politics

- What political system then favors (global) health?




