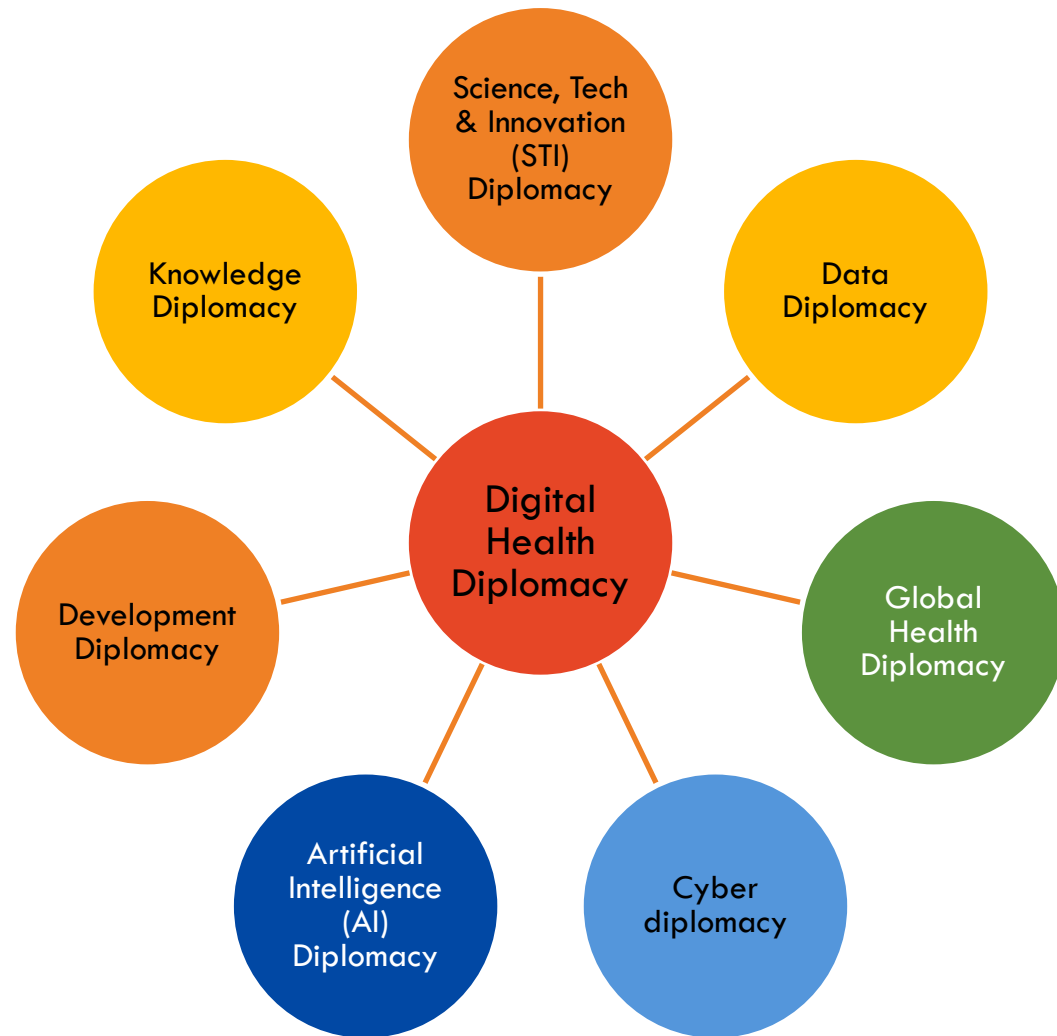

‘Digital Health Diplomacy’: opening the black box



DHD Dimension & Definition	COVID-19-related Examples
1. Diplomacy for Digital Health: Diplomatic means to achieve Digital Health objectives	Countries cooperated diplomatically to institute the use of digital vaccine passports , with the EU’s diplomatic efforts in this regard culminating in the WHO’s Global Digital Health Certification Network. ^{8, 9}
2. Digital health for Diplomacy: Digital Health as a means to achieve Diplomatic objectives	As health data became essential for COVID-19 response, cross-border health data sharing became a signal of diplomatic trust , while delayed/incomplete data sharing bred diplomatic strife . ¹⁰
3. Digital health in Diplomacy: Digital Health informing foreign policy	As COVID-19 drove the adoption of digital health, cybersecurity breaches positioned the cybersecurity of health data as a focus of diplomacy. ^{11, 12}

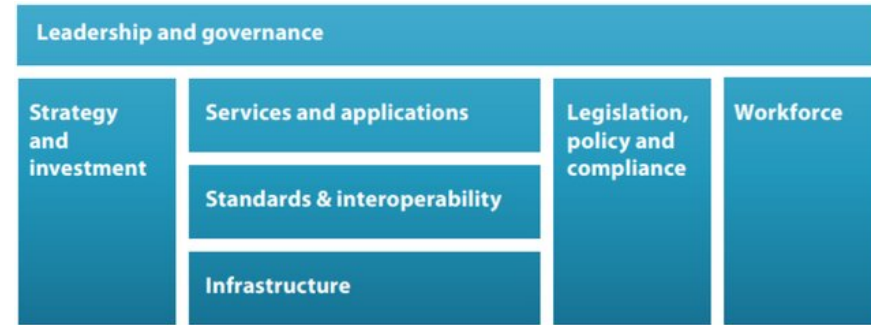

Digital Health Diplomacy at the Global Level: WHO

- Resolutions (eHealth, Digital Health)
- National eHealth Strategy Toolkit
- Global Strategy on Digital Health

4 strategic objectives:

1. promote **global collaboration & knowledge transfer** on DH;
2. advance the **implementation** of national DH strategies;
3. strengthen governance for DH at **global, regional and national levels**;
4. advocate **people-centred health systems** enabled by digital health.

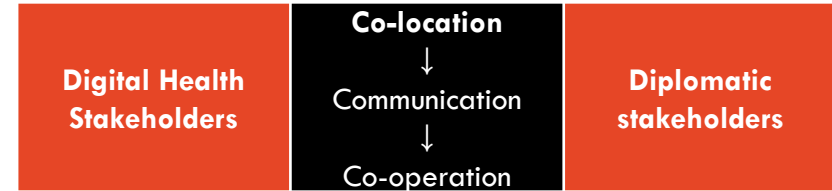

Taiwan's DHD: Preliminary insights

- Taiwan plays an **outsized leadership and agenda-setting role for DHD**
 - Advanced **technical expertise** in digital health (e.g. 'Niche Diplomacy').
 - Health applications in **conflict settings** (e.g. 'Disaster diplomacy')
- Most global meetings in our analysis lacked evidence of **direct collaboration** between digital health stakeholders and their diplomatic counterparts...
- Taiwan's **'co-location'** in Taipei of
 - the APAMI 2022 meeting,
 - the APEC Digital Health Policy Dialogue 2022 &
 - the AeHIN 2022 general meeting
- demonstrates a strategy to effectively facilitate DHD for the **co-creation** of
 - international digital health policy & strategy, and
 - cooperative technical outputs (e.g. AeHIN's Community of Interoperability Labs).

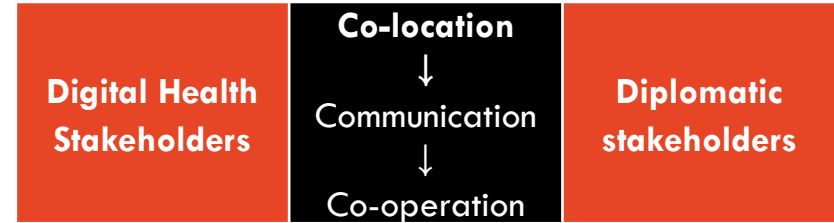

- **Co-Location!**



- **Trends towards Regionalism**

- Deglobalisation & Regionalisation → **“Networked multi-lateralism”**

- DHD requires significant technical knowledge:

- Health Attaches... → **Digital Health Attachés?**

- Not just ‘soft’ power...

- **‘Smart Power’** (both soft & hard power, strategically-applied).

Digital Health in Diplomacy: E.g. Cybersecurity

- **Digital health** informing the design & conduct of **Foreign Policy**.
- Seen in **Taiwan's HIMSS partnership**: '**Cybersecurity** resilience'
 - Australia: Medibank (insurance), MediSecure (ePrescript.), Medlab (pathology)
 - global movement of patients using IoT health devices (e.g., pacemakers);
 - global market: threats are device/company specific (less national).
- Opportunities: countries & organizations could share threat alerts.
- **Geopolitics** in a multipolar world:
 - Security alliances can learn from each other.
 - DHD has a role in guardrails for 'Managed strategic competition' in an increasingly volatile geopolitical landscape.
